It's a wonderful celebration to be "half way"! But what unbelievable strange times you have endured.

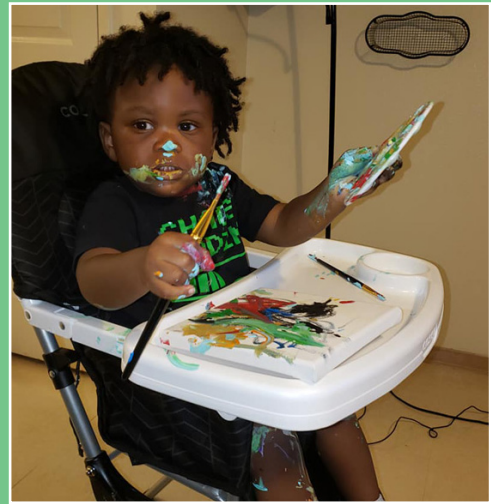
In my eyes, you are heroes. But probably the reality is that you would give anything to once again be regular people who could go anywhere and be with friends whenever you want.

He loves to eat super spicy food

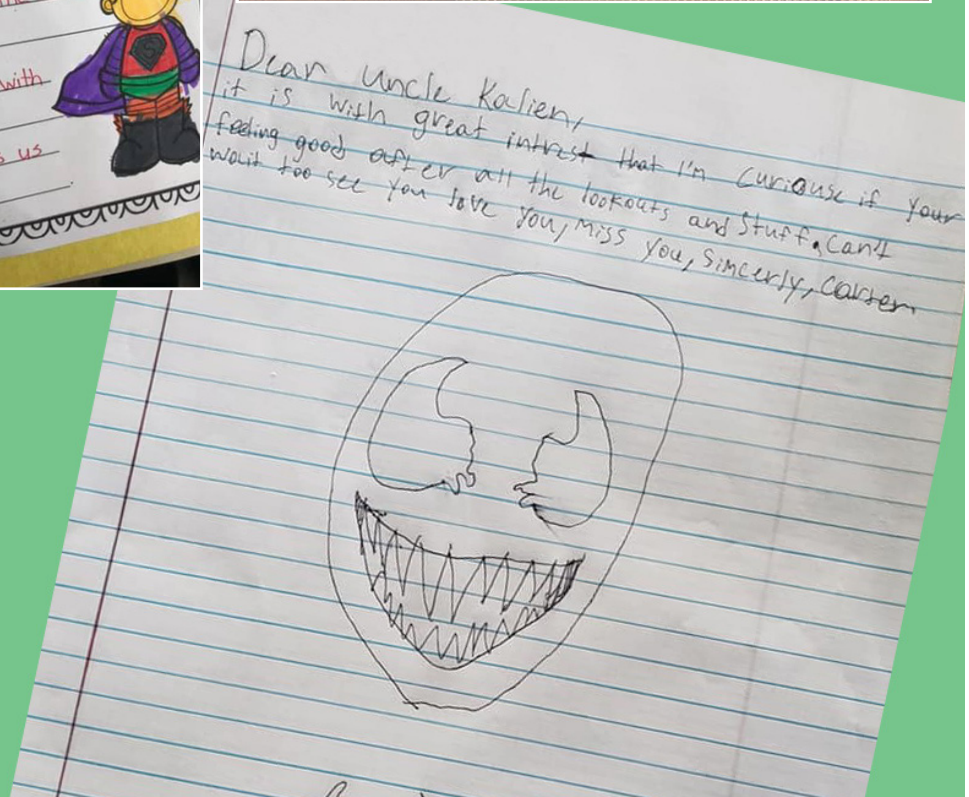
His favorite drink is coffee
